#### Green School News

Our Green School's Committee are spreading awareness that a lot of waste and litter ends up in our rivers, seas and lakes, causing damage to the wild life there and polluting our water. Some of the activities that we have done to work towards our flag include a Beach Clean, an experiment to examine what happens to different materials when they are left in water, an experiment to examine how difficult it is to remove oil from water, adopting and sponsoring a seal, carrying out litter picks and promoting recycling. In January, our green schools committee hopes to carry out a campaign to reduce plastic waste from our school lunches. Also in January, we hope to organise an electrical waste collection.
